#### Happy Summer;

Residents of the Key West Golf Club, Summer is here and things are moving along. Over the summer we have some scheduled projects in progress.

- •We will be incorporating the GYM access cards as the new pool ID's and that is how you will gain entry to the pools. Work is underway and we hope to have it completed sometime in early July.
- •We are also in the process of lighting up the small pool for night swimming. Hours will be the same as the large pool 8am until 10pm.
- This work should be completed in July.
- •Another project we will be completing over the summer is paving. In late August early September, we will be paving from the intersection on Golf Club Drive at Merganser and Whistling Duck to the Kestral intersection of Golf Club Drive. An email will be sent to all residents once a date

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• Other projects we are discussing are expanding the Fitness Center and getting new equipment, working on driveway aprons in the Sanctuary and remodeling Small Pool Bathrooms.

#### PLEASE NOTE:

If you rent your home or have family or friends stay in your home while you are not on property, please fill out the proper paperwork. All the documents can be found online at <u>www.kwgchoa.com</u>.

Short term rentals (6 months or less) or Gratuitous Guests need a Unit Use Form on file. Without this form, parking passes will not be issued. Please add vehicle info and if renting a car please let us know by writing "rental" in the vehicle space. Long term rentals also need a long-term lease agreement signed or the KWGCHOA Management will authorize all vehicles on the property with the proper decals or mirror hangers.

The Management company will not give authorization for any vehicle to be on property overnight unless the proper paper work has been turned in.

If any visitor is staying on property overnight, they must come to the KWGCHOA office with the proper paper work to obtain a parking pass issued by management.

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**Bower Plant** (*Pandorea jasminoides*) One of the sweetest smelling vines in the neighborhood is this easy-to-grow Australian native. It looks terrific on our white picket fences with the pointy green leaves and the copious white flowers with purple (or creamy) centers and the luscious aroma of vanilla.

These vines will grow up to 30 feet long anywhere down here quite quickly once they are established. Remember the old ivy adage: first year it sleeps, second year it creeps, third year it leaps. Judicious plucking of errant strands keep it under control. Pandorea loves full sun, but does not tolerate salt well. There are occasional fruit pods that are woody.


The blooms come mostly in spring, summer and fall and are quite profuse.

## **POOL RULES:**

The pools are for all members to enjoy. Please remember to respect all who attend.

We have two pools and both are heated to 82 degrees for your year 'round swimming pleasure. The small pool is located at Merganser and Golf Club Drive. The larger family pool is located adjacent to the Community Center and is accessible from either Golf Club Drive or Spoonbill Way.

1. Pool use requires an Identification Tag and Key, which will be provided to you by the rental agent or owner. If the ID tag is lost, a replacement can be ordered only by the rental agent or owner.

2. NO climbing on the waterfall.

3. **NO** Diving in the pool.

- 4. Hours are 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM.
- 5. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older.
- 6. **NO** Glass Containers in the pool area.
- 7. **NO** Horseplay in pool area.
- 8. NO Running on pool deck.
- 9. Shower before entering pool.
- 10. Pools are smoke-free.







Number to report a Power Outage or Electrical Emergency **305-295-1010** 

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AND WHEREAS, in Florida, the person for whom a special plate or a disabled person's parking permit is issued:

(a) may park in specially designated and marked motor vehicle parking spaces reserved for their use,

(b) may park without the payment of any fees on the public streets or highways of the State of Florida, and
(c) is not required to pay any parking meter fees of the state, any county, municipality, or any agency of the State of Florida

**To acquire** a handicap placard, a your doctor has to fill out a form explaining the nature if the disability. Take the form to the KWGCHOA office.



# TRASH

Trash is picked up on Friday here. Cans may be put out anytime after 4:00 PM Thursday.

• The Green trash can is for household trash.

• The Blue trash can is for recyclables. (If the can has any plastic bags or any other plastic items, it will NOT be picked up.)

• Yard Waste is to be put in your own personal trash cans with a sticker from the City that states "Yard Waste Only up to 50 pounds.

It is not the Maintenance staff's job to pick up yard waste from your property. Stop putting yard waste at the curb. It makes the community look bad. Waste Management will take it for free if put in a proper container. Call Waste Management 305-289-6037 for a pickup.

• Mark your address on your cans so they can be put away easily by staff.
